Fort Smith, AR (August 20, 2024) – The Degen Foundation is pleased to announce the July 2024 Grant Awards. These organizations are making a difference in our area, especially to the clients that utilize their services. After the sale of Sparks Hospital in 2009, The Degen Foundation was reorganized and now awards grants to other nonprofit organizations that provide health services and promotes health and education to the needs of the uninsured and the underserved population in the seven county area that we serve.

Grants totaling \$622,836.00 were awarded in July to the following organizations.

The Arkansas Colleges of Health Education is a supported organization of The Degen Foundation. They received a grant in the amount of \$602,836.00 to provide debt forgiveness of loans provided to ACHE to assist in the establishment of the Residency Program at Mercy Hospital Fort Smith.

To date, The Degen Foundation has given over \$3.3 million dollars in support of ACHE such as: AED defibrillators, build out of the ARCOM Research Suite, class gifts for each cohort of DO, OT and PT students; research equipment for the Research Institute; assistance in building the Celebration Garden including the Degen Pavilion; and helped to establish the ACHE Scholarship Endowment. We are proud to be a supporting organization to ACHE.





The Fort Smith Boys Home was awarded an \$8,000.00 grant to help establish The Degen Foundation Medical Suite for the Fort Smith Boy's Home Addition Two. The home is a Qualified Residential Treatment Program (QRTP) that provides trauma-informed behavioral health and case management services to children in foster care in a family-like setting. The current home houses twelve children and staff are forced to turn away about two children a week – every week – due to lack of capacity. For this reason, the board has invested \$1.5 million to purchase a second building to double the capacity. This location will serve children from both houses to have access to the suite for care, treatment and education. Treatment for minor issues in-house would allow for earlier detection of emerging medical concerns. The Degen Foundation is proud to assist with this project.
